Public Comment

Update self evaluations and job descriptions

Sense of order – innovation – evaluation and revise policies and practices Mrs. Fulmer noted an item that needs improvement which is chronic/high stress – balance; find balance.

A handout outlining the Governing Board Priorities for 2015-2016 was provided to all present

Site Visits/Site Direction: Each site offered their individual information on priorities which included the top five priorities from the site visits, possible dates for future site visits, professional development days. The suggestion was made for more time at sites for the visits and to have guided conversations from the priority list (see attached summary).

Governing Board Priorities were discussed.

Assessment Framework:

BBHS Math and English Departments are very apprehensive of providing any standards because it becomes a useless tool. There is frustration with the questions last year because they were not relevant.

Ms. Burton is okay with writing assessments; it needs to be more meaningful. Dr. Sanford will create a bank of questions for the departments to build benchmarks around. North Shore feels it is a good compromise for Dr. Sanford to create questions. Dr. Sanford builds the questions from the standards we provide to him.

Wrap Up:

Mr. Zamoyta noted an immediate need for the District; everyone is stressed and over burdened/what happened? This is not good and it is not good for people and student achievement. People have to get out more.

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Dr. Foulkes is concerned with data, assessment, advertising. Dr. Foulkes also noted it seems there is not trust from employees in how we spend our money and this needs to be addressed.

President Grabe stated her frustration with getting stuff done quickly. She is happy about the site visits and the key questions created to discuss. There is concern about how to express to staff what the problems are in our budget. How do we get staff to understand?

Mr. Goepp stated the most important thing to the Governing Board is to fill the superintendent and business officer positions. Mr. Goepp asked the principals and managers to encourage their staff to fill out the survey Mrs. Herrick is happy to have priorities to discuss during the site visits. Ms. Burton stated there is still a problem with teachers being underpaid compared to districts in our area.

Mrs. South stated the classified staff feel very under appreciated most of the time. Health and Welfare is a huge problem and they also do not feel compensated well enough. Departments are extremely underpaid.
