No items were removed from the Consent Calendar other than the items removed on the addendum.

Dr. Suzuki welcomed the new employees approved under the Consent Calendar. Information Dr. Suzuki reviewed upcoming Calendar items including the College/Career Section Fair hosted by Big Bear High School (BBHS) and the Big Bear Chamber of Commerce. Mrs. Tina Fulmer, Principal of BBHS, reported there was going to be over fifty venues at the College/Career Fair held at the Big Bear Convention Center on August 23, 2018.

Dr. Suzuki reported on the Alternate Means of Correction being considered by BVUSD which will allow students and staff an alternative to suspension. Dr. Suzuki expressed the Alternate Means of Correction being considered for grades six through twelve will be proactive for teachers and a restorative piece for students by providing a classroom environment with a support teacher and instruction; reporting the recidivism rate last year was at 70%. Dr. Suzuki reported Ms. Newton and the Principals are working together to establish accurate coding within Infinite Campus and the California Longitudinal Pupil Achievement Data System (CALPADS) for the Alternate Means of Correction attendance reporting. Cabinet and

Principals are reading two books on alternative discipline and restorative practices; Don't Suspend Me and Better Than Carrots and Sticks. Ms. Newton stated an update will be provided at the October 3, 2018 Board Meeting. Ms. Smartt offered to research other school districts and how they administer their alternate means of correction.

Dr. Foulkes reported on his attendance to the Back to School Nights atBoardNorth Shore Elementary School and Big Bear Middle School; noting theyMemberwere both well attended by parents. Dr. Foulkes stated he was impressedCommentsby the organization of the classrooms.Comments

Mrs. Herrick reported on her attendance to three Back to School Nights. Mrs. Herrick stated they were really impressive; noting Chautauqua High School had a barbeque, there was high energy at North Shore Elementary School, and Big Bear Middle School was well attended.

Ms. Smartt reported she was running for the Governing Board unopposed.

Dr. Waner reported on the Cyber Security Class at BBHS being taught Cabinet by Mr. Ken Nettlebeck; noting Mr. Nettlebeck obtained the Career Technical Education Credential over the summer in order to teach this class. The County provided a large screen and a virtual teacher co-teaches the class from Florida. Mrs. Fulmer reported there are twenty three students in the Cyber Security Class and each student is provided with a computer to use while enrolled in the class. The program allows students to obtain a certification establishing they have experience and a skill set when applying for jobs in Cyber Security after high school. Mrs. Fulmer thanked the Governing Board for investing in the students and providing for the Cyber Security class.
