No items were removed from the Consent Calendar.

Information Dr. Suzuki reviewed the employees approved the Consent Calendar and introduced Stacie Golden. Dr. Suzuki also reviewed upcoming activities Section included on the calendar. Dr. Suzuki reviewed the Educational Opportunity Meetings she has been conducting and reviewed the questions attendees were asked. The activity conducted during these meetings was reviewed as was a survey that has been placed on the District's website and Facebook page. Dr. Suzuki noted she will share a matrix and the results from the meetings and survey at the February 20, 2019 Governing Board Workshop Meeting. Mr. Zamoyta noted a book the Education Trust is reading titled "Most Likely Board to Succeed" which pertains to how people redesign schools for 21st Century Member Learning. Mr. Zamoyta offered to bring copies of this book for this board to Comments read. Mr. Zamoyta added Education Trust members are also reading "What Schools Could Be." Ms. Newton reported on beginning the third round of grade level meetings using Cabinet common language to discuss instruction – Effective First Instruction. They **Reports** are focusing around brain research. Clean modeling, primacy/recency, and gradual release are focuses of these meetings. Meetings in the third quarter will cover declarative lessons. Integrating technology into the classroom will also be a focus and Ms. Newton will be working with two grade levels at a time.

Mrs. Rosado reported on the Governor's Budget Workshop held earlier on this date. Mrs. Rosado noted the meeting was interesting with the new Governor coming into office. The impact to K-12 is we will see a COLA for the next three years; COLA only. It was noted they are holding off on decreasing revenues. Mrs. Rosado reviewed the bills introduced to offset CalSTRS; no talk regarding PERS at this time. Mrs. Rosado noted there was not bad news; it is flat. Title I revenues were increased when President Trump approved his budget. More information will come from the May Revise.

President Goepp called for approval of the Administrative Report. Motion by Mrs. Herrick to approve the First Reading of the December 2016 Governing Board Policy Updates. Second by Ms. Smartt. Discussion followed: Mr. Zamoyta noted the topic of homework which came up during his campaign and asked why times are not included any longer in the board policy (the administrative regulation which included times was deleted by Governing Board action on June 20, 2018). Mr. Zamoyta stated the times are helpful for teachers and parents in order for them to know how many minutes students should be working on homework. Mr. Zamoyta asked if guidelines can be considered in order for parents to know what to expect in terms of times for homework. Dr. Waner reviewed the process utilized to make the determination of deleting the administrative regulation and the revision to the board policy. Teachers felt putting in a time limit was restrictive. If a parent has an issue with homework, they can speak with the teacher. The teachers want to be able to make the decision as professionals. Teachers were hoping parents would come to them if there was an issue with times on homework. CSBA deleted the administrative regulation. Mr. Zamoyta again asked about putting guidelines in. Mr. Zamoyta noted his son does not want Mr. Zamoyta to meet with his teachers. Putting a time limit or the teachers reaching out and checking with the parents; communication is huge in this. There is what should happen and what does happen and what is best for students. Mr. Zamoyta asked if there is a limit that is reasonable. Dr. Waner noted the handbooks have a homework section and teachers hand out packets at back-to-school night events. There are parameters in place; they are not in the policy. Mrs. Grabe reviewed the time limits for homework at other districts where she previously worked as well as what was effective in the amount of homework; there is a great deal of research on homework. Mr. Zamoyta noted there needs to be a partnership with parents; communication from teachers to parents is very important. Mr. Zamoyta mentioned a guideline so there is a general idea of what is appropriate. Mr. Zamoyta would like teachers to understand what the purpose of homework is; that it is meaningful and they need to create relationships with parents. Mrs. Grabe asked why AR 6173.3 – Education for Juvenile Court School Students - is included in our policies; she is concerned with this as a directive. Mrs. Grabe asked if the teachers know these students are coming from juvenile court; is there a form we share with teachers. Ms.

Newton noted she has worked on this and communication is in place in order for the teachers to be aware of these students, where they are coming from, and what the offense was. Admin. Report #18-19-005 M18-19-049
