Ms. Smartt stated the CSBA Conference was a treat. Ms. Smartt noted being surprised other districts are having the same problems we are having. Dr. Foulkes reported on his attendance at the CSBA Conference. Dr. Foulkes noted Winters USD and how CTHS and BBHS could be transitioned to a career readiness academy. Dr. Foulkes attended a facility presentation which mostly pertained to contracts. Dr. Foulkes noted he has been uncomfortable with the relationship between the architect and the district. Dr. Foulkes attended a Makers Space presentation; project-based learning environment; holistic approach. Dr. Foulkes stated it might be worthwhile to consider, over time, to have staff talk with other districts about their relationship with their architects; ask if they are happy. His hope is we could get all the files if we go to another firm; Dr. Foulkes thinks we can do better. This is a big decision; one to do carefully. He would be interested in looking at other firms. Mrs. Herrick is very impressed with her daughter who is a graduate of Big Bear High School and is currently living in Italy; completely independent. She has learned the language; it is wonderful to see how much she has grown for the time she has been there.

Mrs. Herrick announced her husband, Mr. Herrick, is officially a candidate for the Assembly. Mr. Goepp appreciated the CSBA Conference very much. Mr. Goepp commented on Morongo Unified having a very mature CTE program with 10-12 pathways; they partner with local community college and the 29 Palms Marine facility. Morongo has also reached out to the Adult Ed Community and they are part of the student population. Teachers are interested because they offer health benefits to the teachers. It appears this is funded through grants. Mr. Goepp also attended a teacher performance session; they have taken the State standards for teaching and they have customized it to make them more personable and aligned with board values and goals. This leads to an evaluation that is custom built.
