President Herrick called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m.

President Herrick reviewed the Quick Summary/Abstract for Public Comment. President Herrick announced that board meetings will be held only in person beginning September 1, 2021. This will be the last meeting that we are holding both in person and on Zoom.

- Mrs. Heather Wylie (Zoom) Mrs. Wylie expressed her appreciation to the Governing Board for agendizing the mask discussion for the upcoming September 1st meeting. She stated that she is encouraged by the willingness of the Board for having that discussion. She will make sure, as best she can, that everyone is aware the meeting will be held in person as we move away from Zoom comments. Mrs. Wylie provided information on a rally that will take place in front of the District Office before the September 1st Board meeting.
- 2. Mr. Kirk Garrison (Zoom) Mr. Garrison shared that he has a daughter that attends Fallsvale Elementary School. Mr. Garrison expressed his support for the mask policy in order to keep our kids learning in person. Mr. Garrison cited statistics indicating that there were 121,000 child COVID-19 cases last week, 99 percent of which were of the Delta variant. Mr. Garrison stated that he has young, healthy coworkers who have gotten sick, given it to their parents, and the parents have passed away. Mr. Garrison cited an article in the Tampa Bay Times by the chief pathologist for the V.A. system in Iowa. The Delta variant was four times more infectious than the original. Mr. Garrison continued saying that the Delta variant is primarily seen in younger people, as evidenced by the American Academy of Pediatrics. There have been outbreaks amongst kids in summer camps, which may have been related to one of the recent outbreaks in Big Bear. Mr. Garrison stated that the American Academy of Pediatrics recommends masks for schools. Mr. Garrison said the most important thing is keeping the kids learning in school. As a forensic pathologist working crime scenes, Mr. Garrison shared that wearing a mask is not uncomfortable, and they do work. Mr. Garrison expressed his support for what the school district is doing.

9. Information Section and Reports

9.a. Superintendent Comments

Dr. Suzuki provided an update on her visit to Big Bear High School, where students are enjoying learning together. Dr. Suzuki provided information on the popular Learning by Making course which is a CSTEM course and College Board approved. This class is taught by Mr. Hoak. Dr. Suzuki expressed her appreciation to Dr. Waner for bringing this course to our district and Mr. Hoak for attending the required training over the summer. Dr. Suzuki continued sharing information on the new aviation class that is being offered this year. There are 17 students enrolled in this class. The simulators the Governing Board approved should be here soon. Dr. Suzuki expressed her gratitude to Julie Smith for attending training this summer and Dr. Waner for researching and bringing this program to our district. Dr. Suzuki spoke about the Governor's order that came out on August 11^{th,} requiring the district to have proof of vaccine documentation. Dr. Suzuki outlined the process for testing unvaccinated employees and shared that we need to comply with the Governor's Order by October 15th. There will be no cost to employees for this mandated testing. Dr. Suzuki shared that our current enrollment is 2176.

9.b. Governing Board Member Reports

Mr. Roberts spoke about the school lunch options. He shared that his children told his wife they would rather go hungry than eat what they are given at school. Mr. Roberts continued saying that what we offer students is important, not packaged, and full of preservatives. Mr. Roberts stated that we can do better and need to look into it.

Mrs. Rosado shared that Child Nutrition Services offers hand-packed salads because, due to COVID requirements, we cannot have an open salad bar. Mrs. Rosado also spoke to some of the challenges Child Nutrition Services is having obtaining food.
